In October of 2019, a small group of Crooked River Ranch , OR residents gathered in the Juniper Room of the CRR Administration to participate in a visioning meeting regarding health and wellbeing factors in the community, led by members of the JeffCo Connects Community Network. Using a combination of brainstorming and prioritization processes called nominal group technique, each facilitated table worked to identify supports, challenges, and solutions to health and wellbeing issues in Crooked River Ranch. The following is an ordered compilation of priorities identified, as well as themes that surfaced in the small groups. These ideas will be triangulated and considered as local and county-wide priorities are identified by the network for focused efforts over the next 5 years.

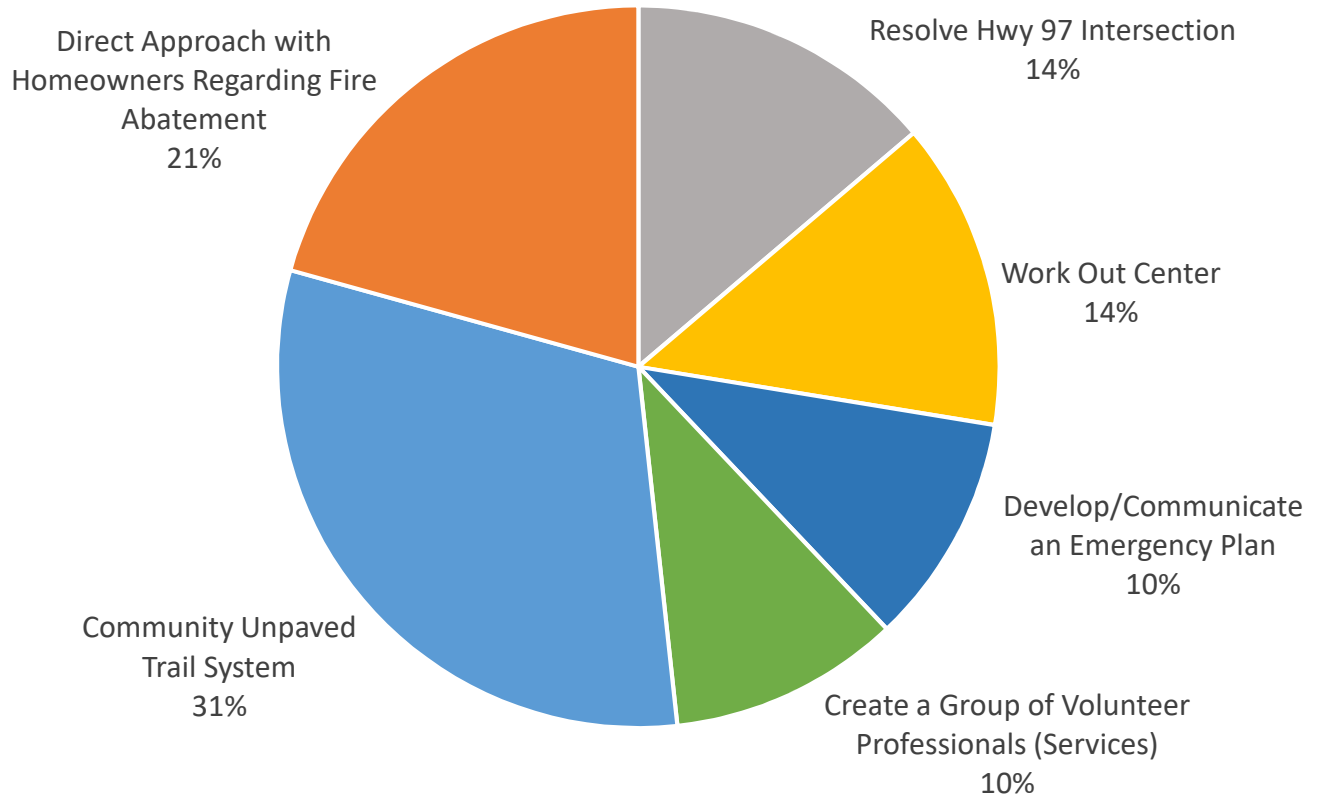

Affinity Groups	Responses
Resources for Youth and Families	Start a teen club; Open a school on the Ranch; Evening activities for working families
Increasing Volunteerism	Create a group of volunteer professionals; Create a volunteer pool to check on isolated people; Volunteers to help with repairs; Expanded neighborhood watch; Purchase a community snow plow
Health Resource Access	Local healthcare clinic; Telemedicine access; Weekly medical clinic
Opportunities for Fitness	Build a community unpaved trail system on community properties(decrease isolation); Visiting fitness instructor; Workout center (incentivize)
Food System	Build a community garden; Open a health food store
Community Safety	Direct approach with homeowners regarding fire abatement; Lower speed limits; Local police; Develop and communicate emergency plan; Resolve Hwy 97 intersection issue
Communication	Utilize different types of communication (Telegraph); Improve communication of resources; Simplification of HOA website; Hire a professional to clarify common values; Don't get upset as easily
Rules and Regulations	Send out reminders in county tax bill; Use of technology for nuisance reporting; Direct approach with homeowners about fire abatement; Weed abatement plan; Brochure for realtors regarding weed maintenance; County to increase fines for code violations

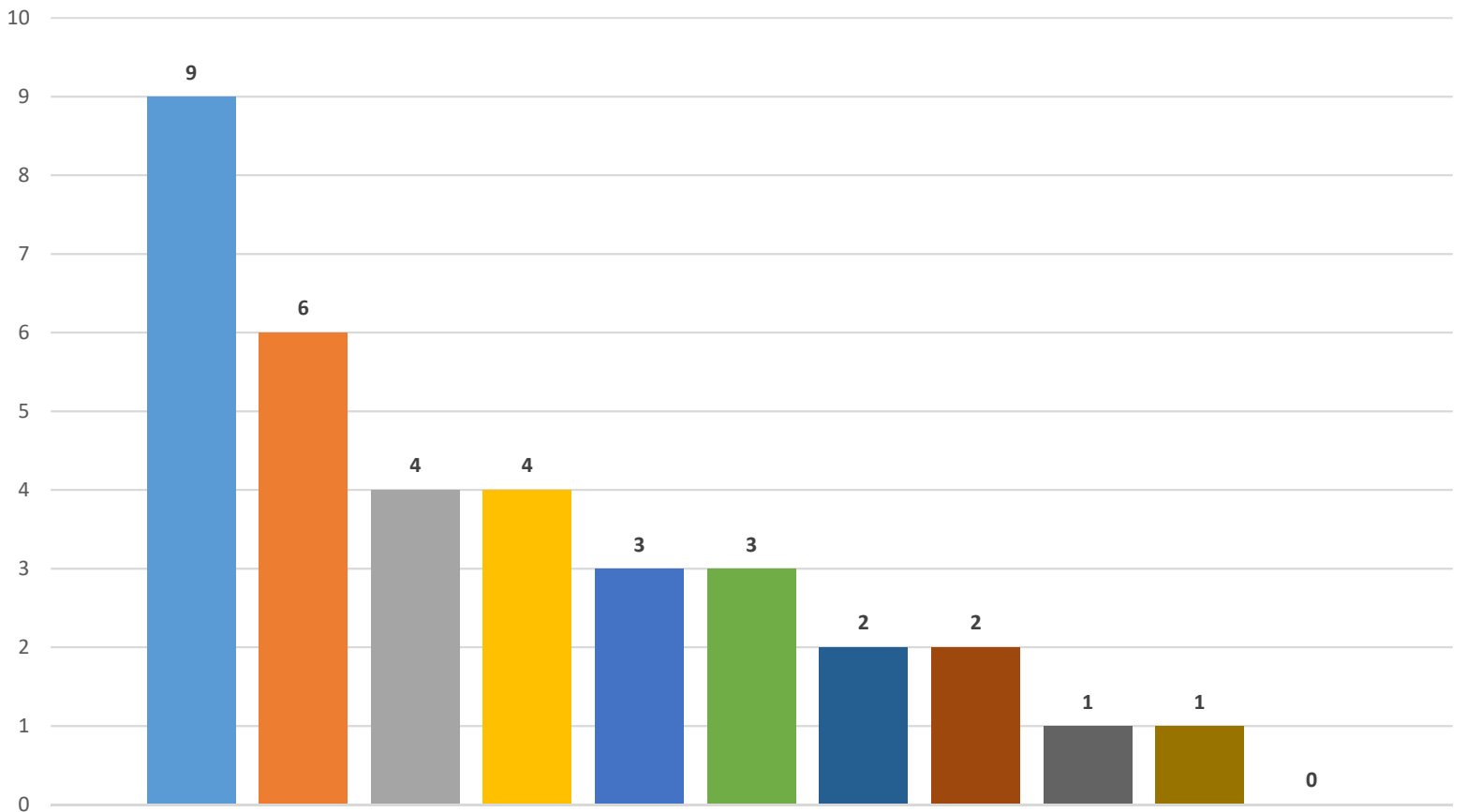

Crooked River Ranch Priorities

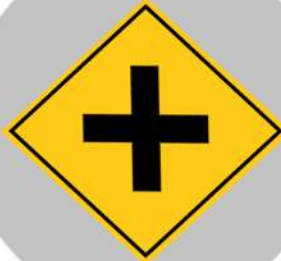


Crooked River Ranch Priorities Key

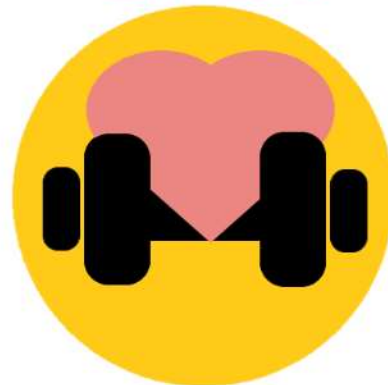
